ENTRIES

Entries are now open and competitor tickets can be purchased [HERE](#). The fee is \$300 plus booking fees and includes an event hat and t-shirt, plus 3 complimentary spectator tickets.

SANCTIONING & LICENCING

This Event is sanctioned by the Australian Auto-Sports Alliance (AASA) and will be conducted under the [National Competition Rules \(NCR's\)](#), these Event Supplementary Regulations, the [Entrant Terms and Conditions](#), and any further bulletins issued. By entering this event, you agree to comply with these regulations.

All Entrants must have a AASA license to compete. If required, a single day license will be issued at the event (there is no additional cost to the Entrant).

Additionally, drivers must present a valid and unrestricted driver's license at Scrutineering and per the Entrant Terms and Conditions.

DRUGS & ALCOHOL

In accordance with the AASA NCR's, any Entrant may be tested for the presences of drugs or alcohol at the event and must present a reading of 0.00 to participate.

The AASA policy is zero tolerance of any substance that may, in any way, impair and/or stimulate competitors, pit crew and official's performances.

FUEL

Entrants can bring maximum 40L in jerrycans and re-fuel in the pits.

DRIVER APPAREL

All driver apparel must meet the flowing requirements to compete:

- Neck to ankle to wrist cover
- Fully enclosed footwear
- A compliant and approved automotive helmet (*Refer to the AASA NCR's G5.6*)
 - Australian Standard AS 1698 and Snell SA2010, 2015 or 2020
- Race suits are recommended but not mandatory

VEHICLE & SAFETY REQUIREMENTS

TYRES

Entrants must use approved street tyres. Street tyres are defined as any treaded, non-competition tyre with a 180-tread wear rating or higher. In addition, tyre changing is prohibited and Entrants must use a single set of tyres for all segments. In the event of a catastrophic failure, tyre changes may be allowed at the discretion of the Event Officials. Replacement tyres must be of the same manufacturer and model as those approved during scrutineering.



VEHICLE COMPLIANCE

All vehicles entered in the Event must be domestic or import four-wheeled vehicles that are licensed, registered, insured for regular street use, and have a factory affixed OE manufactured production tag or plate.

Open wheeled vehicles are not permitted, and all vehicles must use a factory or reproduction bonnet, structural fenders, and body panels. Scoops, flares, and other modifications are acceptable.

All convertibles or roadsters must have rollover protection for the Drag Racing segment. Convertibles or open-top vehicles are required to wear arm restraints during the Hot Laps and Drag Racing segments.

All Entrant vehicles must pass a safety inspection that will include but may not be limited to the following:

- Functional seat belts
- Proper brake pedal pressure and travel
- Sufficient throttle return spring and secured battery
- All lug nuts in place and tight
- Hubcaps/clip-on center caps are to be removed
- All loose items must be removed from the vehicle, including but not limited to – floor mats, phone mounts, luggage, boots items, and items hanging from the rearview mirror.

Note: Passengers are not permitted during competition.

CLASSES

Entrants will nominate and compete in one of the following classes:

1. Muscle – 1999 or older
2. Modern – 2000 to present
3. Tuner – 1990 or newer JDM spec
4. Exotics – supercars, hypercars, grand tourers
5. Outlaw – vehicles that do not meet the competition regulations OR a vehicle driven by a professional driver. *Note: entrants competing in the outlaw class are NOT eligible to win the overall event award "the Ultimate Street Car winner."*

SEGMENTS

Entrants must compete in all segments of the event to qualify to be the OPTIMA Ultimate Street Car. The segments are as follows:

- Auto Test
- Speed Stop
- Hot Laps (Novice, Intermediate, Expert – group allocation at the discretion of Event Officials)
- Drag Racing
- Design & Engineering



Note: Participation in Roll Racing is complementary for all Entrants and is not included as part of the OPTIMA Ultimate Street Car competition.

Each segment of the event will be timed to 0.00.00. A 100-point scoring system will award points based on the best time in each segment. The entrant with the most combined points in the overall event wins.

AWARDS

Class winners receive a trophy, presented at the Podium Party.
